## DAY SCHOOL ON NICARAGUA

On 25 April, 1990 the US backed UNO government took office after 11 years of Sandinista government. The purpose of the day school will be to look at UNO policies, the impact they have had on the people's lives and how the Sandinista party (FSLN) in opposition has worked with the mass organisations to defend the gains of the Revolution. The main themes of the Day School will be:

- Nicaragua in the present regional and global context
- one year of UNO government the balance of political power within Nicaragua
- the role of the FSLN and mass organisations in defending the gains of the Revolution
- debates and restructuring within the FSLN
- future solidarity work in support of the FSLN, trade unions and mass organisations.
